#### **Pokémon**

We have noticed recently that children are bringing Pokémon trading cards to school. Whilst we have enjoyed seeing the children discussing and playing with Pokémon cards there have been too many problems with children swapping and trading with each other.

We strongly advise that you do not allow your child to bring
Pokémon cards into school, unless attending kS2 Pokémon
Club during Wednesday lunchtimes.

If a child has Pokémon cards in school from Monday onwards, the class teacher may decide to look after them for the day!

#### Facebook

We would like to remind parents that Facebook must not be used to notify the school of absences or to arrange meetings. These procedures must be done through the school office.

The attendance policy is now available on the school website, along with forms that can be downloaded for any absences seeking authorisation.



As set out in the attendance policy there may be occasions when a child has to miss school, for example if he or she has a specific illness and has made an appointment with the G.P. Every half day absence from school is recorded as either authorised or unauthorised which is why information about the reason for each absence is always required. If a child is ill, parents and carers are asked to inform the school by 9.00 a.m. on each morning of the absence.
