Jewellery in School

We have noticed at the start of this term that a number of pupils have been wearing jewellery which is not appropriate for school. Items such as expensive bracelets, hooped earrings and necklaces have already been seen during the first few days.

Wearing such jewellery in school can pose safety risks. For example, hooped earrings may result in torn earlobes, necklaces could present a strangulation hazard if caught, and metal bracelets could accidentally scratch or injure another child.

To ensure the safety of all pupils, the only jewellery permitted in school is small ear studs which do not protrude beyond the edge of the ear lobe. These must be either removed or securely taped over during PE lessons.

Thank you for your support in helping us maintain a safe environment for all children.
