


This Week in: Reception



In Reception our topic is "What's on the menu?"

STEM



STEM is one of the many activities offered on a Friday as part of our KS2 enrichment afternoon, but what actually is it?

STEM stands for science, technology, engineering and maths, and during enrichment we find out how these four subjects work together in the real world. Our sessions are very practical and after initial discussions and time to plan, the children create wonderful solutions to the problems they have to solve. Currently, each group designs a trap to help an animal who lives in the dark, test the idea that hair could be strong enough to hold an adult's weight (think Rapunzel) and create a building that would survive an earthquake; we test this one with a pan of jelly!

Whilst problem solving is at the heart of our STEM activities, STEM learning also develops many of Westfield's values; creativity, collaboration and resilience to name just a few.
