Payment will remain open on Arbor until the 31st March.






Mrs Carver requested some cuddly toys from the charity 'Knit for Nowt' and we were successful. Here are some of our children trying them out with Mrs Carver!





This Week in: Year 6

Books

It has been a particularly busy time in Year 6! We've enjoyed learning about World War II as part of our history topic. We have used the theme of 'Evacuation' as a basis for our writing unit as part of our English learning by planning, drafting and writing a balanced argument about whether children should have been evacuated during World War II.

As well as this, we have loved our recent class text 'Peanut Jones and the Illustrated City! We can't wait to find out if Peanut can complete her mission and defeat the villainous Mr White!



In maths, we have been exploring decimals- this includes rounding, ordering and multiplying and dividing. Maths Talk has been a focus of many of our lessons, talking together about how to solve trickier, problem solving questions.

This term, our science topic is Light. We will be exploring shadows and refraction over the coming weeks. As the weather continues to improve (hopefully) we will be enjoying more fun outside PE sessions with Mrs Randle.

'Why does our skin bruise?'


