Bath City Football Tournament

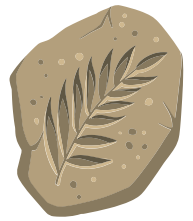

This week in Year 3



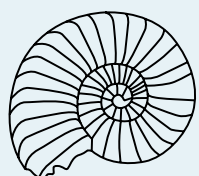
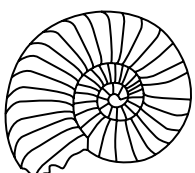
Year 3 had a great time visiting the Earth Science Centre this week.

They had the opportunity to visit Whatley Quarry and saw the enormous vehicles transporting the rocks into the crusher.

They also investigated a variety of different rocks and carried out experiments to determine whether they were absorbent and to see how hard or soft they were.
