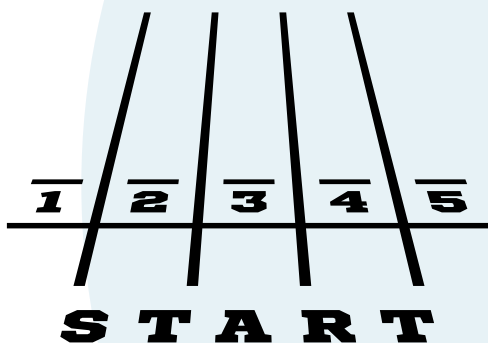

Last Term in Year 4

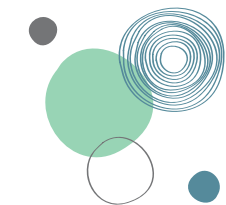


Term 5 was jam-packed for Year 4! We certainly squeezed a lot into a short term.

The highlight for most children was the annual residential trip to Greetwood. For many children this was the first time away from home and family. With bags packed, the children set off for 3 days of fun-filled team building activities including raft building, duck racing, archery, climbing, river studies and, of course, songs around the campfire



We shared our stories and photos with families in our camp assembly which was attended by a huge number of parents (We've never seen the hall so full!) All staff were impressed by the impeccable behaviour of the year group. Both classes were fantastic ambassadors for our school.



After camp, we started our second Design Technology project of the year-pavilions. Children created 3D structures using spaghetti and marshmallows with the aim of making a stable frame. After we had explored which shapes were the strongest, we then designed our pavilion with a chosen theme. Themes included nature, films, colours and animals. The children safely used a range of materials to build their own structure and each one was as creative and individual as the maker.

Last Term in Year 4

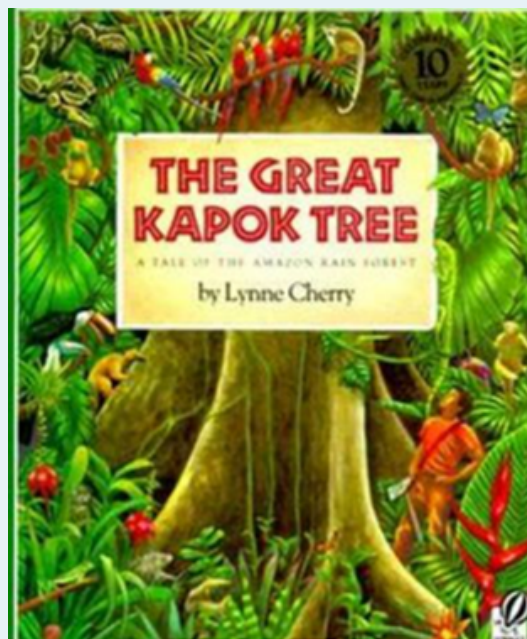

We all had great fun exploring pairs of rhyming foods and playing with ways to describe their taste.

This week in Year 1 & 2



This week in science, Year 1 and 2 have been investigating the different habitats found around our school grounds.

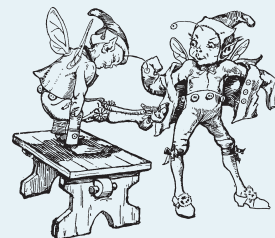
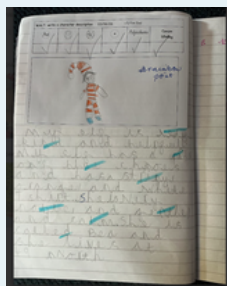
Using their observational skills, the children carefully explored each habitat and identified a variety of plants by examining and comparing their leaves.

They then applied their mathematical skills to collect, record and present their findings using tally charts and pictograms. The children enjoyed working as scientists and mathematicians, developing their understanding of habitats while learning how to gather and interpret data.



We have also been retelling the story of The Elves and the Shoemaker.

We used puppets to retell the story using lots of great story language



We worked with partners to answer questions about the text and we wrote our answers on post it notes to go on our class Working wall

We used our imaginations to create our own elf character and wrote about them.

Reminder Regarding PE Kit Requirements

It has come to the school's attention that a number of pupils have repeatedly forgotten to bring their PE kit or to come to school without the correct kit for PE lessons. The school would like to take this opportunity to remind parents and carers of the importance of pupils being properly equipped for PE each week.

Physical Education is an essential part of the school curriculum, promoting health, fitness, and teamwork. To minimise the likelihood of pupils forgetting their kit, the school requests that all children bring a PE kit which can be kept in school from Monday to Friday and taken home for washing at the end of each week.

It has also been observed that some pupils are attending PE lessons wearing their school shoes. This poses a significant health and safety risk, as inappropriate footwear can lead to slips, trips, and falls. In accordance with the school's uniform policy, every pupil is required to have the correct PE kit and footwear for each lesson.

This matter is being monitored closely. Pupils who continue to attend PE lessons without the appropriate kit will first receive a verbal reminder. Should the issue persist, the class teacher will arrange a meeting with parents or carers to discuss any difficulties that may be preventing the pupil from bringing a PE kit to school each week. If the matter remains unresolved, a member of the Senior Leadership Team will formally invite parents or carers to a meeting to discuss the issue further.

The school wishes to acknowledge and commend those pupils who consistently bring their PE kits and take part in lessons prepared and ready to learn. For those who may occasionally forget, a limited number of spare PE kits are available from the school office. However, this resource is not intended for regular use, as frequent borrowing places additional demands on school resources for washing and maintenance.

The school appreciates the cooperation and support of all parents and carers in ensuring that pupils are safe, properly equipped, and able to participate fully in PE lessons.
